Preparation for an Oneg Shabbat

Please return the "Oneg Shabbat Sponsor Confirmation" form to the office at Temple Beth David in the enclosed envelope. If you have chosen the Assisted or Sponsored Oneg, please also enclose your check made out to Temple Beth David or your credit card information. Remember to add \$40 if you have chosen to use tablecloths for the Do-It-Yourself, Assisted or Sponsored Oneg. If you have selected the Catered Oneg, you must contact the caterer of choice immediately to make all arrangements.

The amounts of food and drink listed below are for a typical Friday night service of about 30 people; a special occasion, holiday or family night service may need additional food and help for the larger number of people attending. Sisterhood supplies paper goods, unless you want to provide a special design or color. A Kiddush cup, challah cover, cutting board and knife, serving dishes and utensils are available in the kitchen.

A regular Friday night service and oneg is usually attended by about 30 people. If there are over 50 people, we need to arrange for more food and drink and additional help for set up and clean up. (This includes the usual 30 plus 20 additional people you expect to attend the oneg.)

Choose one of the four levels of Oneg Shabbat sponsorship:

Do-It-Yourself Oneg: You are responsible for bringing food and drink, setting up, serving and cleaning up the social hall and the kitchen afterwards. Please bring the items listed below before the service begins, and allow yourself enough time to set up before the service starts. **Cost: No additional cost beyond items you provide, \$40 cleaning fee if you would like to use tablecloths.**

Oneg items to provide for usual service (30 people).

Challah, one or two unsliced for a regular service. Available at Noah's, Howes, Monrovia Bakery, and Whole Foods

Cream cheese, 8 ounce size

Jam or jelly, 8 to 16 ounce jar

Cookies, cake, fruit, treats, to serve 30 people, for example 3 packages of cookies and 2 cakes or equivalent.

Kosher wine, one bottle of Manischewitz, Carmel or other sweet wine for Kiddush

Juice or punch, at least two gallons

Decaffeinated Coffee, 1 pound drip grind

Tea Bags herbal or regular decaffeinated tea

Creamer or half-and-half, 1 pint

Assisted Oneg: You will provide the food and drink as listed above. A temple employee will set up, serve and clean up afterwards. Please bring food and drink listed at least 15 minutes before the service begins. If you would like to deliver items for the Oneg Shabbat prior to Friday night, please make arrangements with the office staff to drop items off during regular business hours. **Cost: \$50 for up to 50 people, \$100 for over 50 people, plus additional \$40 cleaning fee if you would like to use tablecloths.** (plus the cost of food that you bring).

Sponsored Oneg: Sisterhood will purchase food and drink. A temple employee sets up, serves and cleans up. **Cost: \$120 for up to 50 people, \$185 for 50 to 100 people, plus additional \$40 cleaning fee if you would like to use tablecloths.**

Catered Oneg: If you have chosen a catered Oneg, you are responsible for making the arrangements directly with the caterer of choice. They must provide the food as listed above, set up and serve, and clean up the social hall and kitchen. Remember to adjust the portions listed so there is sufficient food for the total number of people attending. **Cost: Discuss and arrange directly with the caterer.**
